MRF F2000 will renew rivalry between Chheda and Ishaan

The second round of the MRF MMSC FMSCI Indian National Car Racing Championship 2025, with 82 entries, will get underway at the Madras International Circuit in Chennai on Saturday. The two-day event features a card of 12 races, comprising triple headers in the combined grid of MRF Formula 2000 and Formula 1600. The MRF F2000 will see a renewal of rivalry between championship leader Arjun Chheda and Ishaan Madesh, with just six points separating the pair. Similarly, it appears to be a straight fight between teenage leader Sai Shiva Makesh Sankaran and second-placed Nigel Abraham Thomas, who is four points adrift. Meanwhile, only four points separate former champion Arjun Balu and Dhruv Chavan. Defending champion Biren Pithawalla (N1 Racing) is currently third in the championship in the premier Indian Touring Cars category.

Local ace Ritesh Rai (Buzzing Hornet) made it a three in a row in the second round of the MRF MMSC fmsci Indian National Car Racing Championship 2025 at the Madras International Circuit on Sunday.

Driving a Volkswagen Polo, Ritesh won all three races in the top-end Indian Touring Cars (ITC) category, displaying impressive pace and nerves to hold off strong challenge from Coimbatore veteran Arjun Balu (Race Concepts).

Chennai's Deepak Ravikumar (Team Performance Racing) was the other highlight of the weekend as he marked his return to racing after recovering from a massive Superbike crash at the Buddh International Circuit last year that was followed by a 10-month recovery and rehabilitation. Ravikumar won twice in the Indian Junior Touring Cars class today, as did Thrissur's Diljith TS (DTS Racing) in the Super Stock category

The storied Madras International Circuit here will again reverberate with the sound of finely tuned racing engines as the second round of the MRF MMSC FMSCI Indian National Car Racing Championship 2025 gets underway on Saturday, September 20, having received 82 entries across

all categories.

The two-day event has a card of 12 races that comprise of triple-headers in the combined grid of MRF Formula 2000 and Formula 1600 that will headline the event, the touring cars with its three sub-categories all to be run concur-rently, besides the Volkswagen Polo Cup, the Volkswagen Polo Cup, the Saloons and the popular, entry-level Formula LGB 1300 that boasts of a big grid of 22 single-seaters. The saloon car races are bound to set the adrena-line coursing with 32 cars lining up on the combined

grid which is a sure recipe for drama and hot action. The F2000 will see a renewal of rivalry between championship leader Arjun Chheda from Pune, who won two of the three



races in the previous round in Coimbatore, and Bengaluru's Ishaan Madesh with just six points separating the pair. Similarly, it appears to be a straight fight between leader Sai Shiva Makesh Sankaran, the 17-year-old from Pune, and second-placed Bengaluru's Nigel Abraham Thomas who is four points adrift, both having won a race apiece in the Coimbatore round. Only four points separate

Only four points separate former champion Arjun Balu, the Coimbatore ace piloting a Race Conceptsprepared Honda City Vtec, and Lonavala's privateer Dhruv Chavan while defending champion Biren Pithawalla (NI Racing) is currently third in the championship in the premier Indian Touring Cars category. The trio is expected to do the frontrunning this weekend. The highly competitive Indian Junior Touring Cars category sees the return of the Performance Racing team that had prepared Honda City Vtec,

Racing team that had skipped the first round in Coimbatore, with a two-car tandem of Deepak tandem Deepak Ravikumar and Viswas Vijayaraj, a former Formula LGB 1300 champion. Championship leader Rithwik Thomas (Race Concepts) from Bengaluru

Concepts) from Bengaluru can expect a strong challenge from the experienced Performance Racing pair. Sri Lankan Kesara Godage of Red Line Racing India won two of the three races in Coimbatore which puts him at the top of the leaderboard in the Super Stock class. 10 points ahead Stock class, 10 points ahead of Guwahati's Krishanu Dutta Bhuyan (Zion Racing).

The situation in the Formula LGB 1300 category is much closer with just nine points covering the top

nine points covering the top six in the championship standings headed by 19-year-old Joel Joseph (DTS Racing) from Ernakulam. In the VW Polo Cup, which will be run concur-rently with the MRF Saloons, Navi Mumbai's Aditya Patnaik leads Aman Nagdev (Noida) by one Adulya Patnaik leads Aman Nagdev (Noida) by one point with Pratik Sonawane (Mumbai) a fur-ther seven points behind. The Polo Cup dished out

some close races and the trend is likely to continue this weekend. Chennal's Ritesh Rai (Buzzing Hornet), driving a Volkswagen Polo, scored a commanding win in the premier Indian Touring Cars class of the second round of the MRF MMSC FMSCI Indian National Car Racing Championship at the Madras

Pithawalla, also in a VW Polo, finished second after easing past Balu whose Honda City V-tec developed issues in the very first lap.

Team Performance Racing, returning to the championship after missing the previous round, delivered a podium sweep in the Indian Junior Touring Cars class with Viswas Vijayaraj (Nellore) taking Pl ahead of Deepak Ravikumar (Chennai) and Hattim Shabir (Chennai). Thrissur's TS Diljith took the honours in the Super Stock class with an easy win. The 30-car combined grid dished out its fair quota of jostling and shunting initially and then bitter fights for track



positions up and down the


positions up and down the field.

Veteran Vidyaprakash Damodaran from Coimbatore (Performance Racing), who turned 30 last month, topped the ITC 1625 category for his second win of the season.

Meanwhile, DTS Racing swept the podium spots in both Open and Junior classes of the Formula LGB 1300 category with Vinith Kumar from Tirupur notching a fine double.

Arjun Chheda (Pune) and Arjun S Nair (Bengaluru) notched fluent wins in the MRF Formula 2000 and Formula 1600 categories, respectively.

Chheda, 17, made a good start from pole position and won untroubled and unchallenged while posting his second consecutive win and third in four starts, this season. Finishing behind him were Bengaluru's Ethan Joy and Ishaan Madesh.



Similarly, 20-year-old Nair scored a fine win after pole-sitter Sai Shiva Makesh Sankaran (Pune) retired after Lap-I, with Mumbai's Zahan Commissariat finishing second ahead of Gyan S (Chennai) in the eight-lap race that saw a combined grid of the two categories. Aman Nagdev (Noida) held off Navi Mumbai pair of Ojas Surve and Aditya Patnaik for a deserving win in the Volkswagen Polo Cup that was run concurrently with the MRF Saloons class where Chennai's Mohamed Arafath beat Tarushi V i k r a m (Chikkamagaluru) in a tight finish while Akshay M u r a 1 i t h a r a n (Coimbatore) came in a distant third.

Rivalries to resume in bike racing

The MRF MMSC FMSCI National Indian National Motorcycle Championship 2025 enters a crucial phase where every point earned or lost will count as 152 rid-ers and 18 teams assemble the Madras International Circuit for the three-day Round 4 com-mencing on Friday.

mencing on Friday.
After three rounds so far, the titles are up for grabs in all the National and One-Make Championships (Petronas TVS and TVS Honda India Idemitsu Honda India Talent Cup) categories. Those in the front will have to soak in considerable pressure to protect their leaderboard positions given the highly competitive nature of the

petitive nature of the championship. The premier Pro-Stock 301-400cc Open class has witnessed fierce battles with Hyderabad's Rahil Pillarisetty (RACR Castrol Power1) on a Yamaha R3 and Pune teenager and defending champion defending champion Sarthak Chavan (Petronas TVS Racing) involved in a virtual slugfest. Both have won three races apiece this season with 27-year-old Pillarisetty ahead by just nine points. The rivalry between the two has evolved into a blockbuster that will headline a card of 20 races besides 11 official practice and as many qualifying sessions.
The intensity of competi-

tion is no less in other categories where the championship leaders will have no respite in their bid to pro-

tect their positions.

Two Bengaluru riders,
18-year-old Savion Sabu
and his Mad Rabbit Racing team-mate, Varun Patil, 31, head the Pro-Stock 165-200cc Open and Stock 301-400cc (Novice) categories, respectively, despite up-and-down performances that has seen them drop points as well as notch wins, but both will be required to be on pace to consolidate their points.

A pair from Hyderabad, Mohammed Samrul Zubair (Motul Sparks Racing), who has per-formed consistently this season with two wins and a podium in four starts and Rajender Beedani (MAI Racing) head the Super

Stock Intermediate 165cc and Stock 165cc (Novice) classes, respectively, albeit

not by much.
In contrast, last year's title winner Chennai's Jagathishree Kumaresan (One Racing), aided by four back-to-back wins, is comfortably placed in the Girls (Stock 165cc) category with a 16-point cushion against former champion Ann Jennifer (Motul Sparks Racing), also from Chennai.

In the Petronas TVS One-Make Championship, Mohan Babu (Chennai), Hari Haran (Coimbatore) and Jagathishree Kumaresan have delivered consistently strong per-formances to perch on top of the leaderboard in the Expert (Apache RTR 310),

Rookie (Apache RTR 200) and Women (Apache RTR 200) categories, respective ly, while Sarthak Chavan, with three consecutive wins, is in command in the

Chennai's **Deepak Ravikumar (Team Performance Racing)** made a dream return after a year-long injury layoff, winning both races in the **Indian Junior Touring Cars** class. **Diljith TS (DTS Racing)** from Thrissur mirrored that success in **Super Stock**, also taking back-to-back wins.

The Formula LGB 1300 races produced some of the closest finishes of the weekend, with Aditya Patnaik (Momentum Motorsports) and Vinith Kumar (DTS Racing) sharing victories. In the Volkswagen Polo Cup, Ojas Surve (Navi Mumbai) and Aman Nagdev (Noida) took a win each. Meanwhile, Coimbatore's Akshay Muralidharan dominated the MRF Saloons, bagging both Sunday races.

Arjun Chheda and Arjun S Nair Shine in MRF MMSC fmsci National Car Racing Championship Round 2



Chennai, September 20, 2025: Pune's Arjun Chheda and Bengaluru's Arjun S Nair produced commanding performances to take top honours in the MRF Formula 2000 and MRF Formula 1600 categories, respectively, setting the pace in the second round of the MRF MMSC fmsci Indian National Car Racing Championship 2025 at the Madras International Circuit (MIC) on Saturday.

Seventeen-year-old Chheda, starting from pole, drove a flawless race to clinch his **second consecutive victory and third win of the season**, ahead of Bengaluru duo **Ethan Joy** and **Ishaan Madesh**. In the Formula 1600 race, 20-year-old Nair capitalized after pole-sitter Sai Shiva Makesh Sankaran retired on the opening lap. **Mumbai's Zahan Commissariat**finished second while **Chennai's Gyan S** claimed third place.

In the **Indian Touring Cars (ITC)** class, Chennai's **Ritesh Rai** (Buzzing Hornet), who skipped the first round, stormed to victory in his Volkswagen Polo, leaving behind defending champion **Biren Pithawalla** and veteran **Arjun Balu**. Coimbatore's **Vidyaprakash Damodaran**, who turned 80 last month, continued to impress with his **second win of the season** in the **ITC 1625cc** category.

Team Performance Racing marked a strong comeback, sweeping the podium in the Indian Junior Touring Cars class with Viswas Vijayaraj leading from Deepak Ravikumar and Hattim Shabir. In Super Stock, TS Diljith of Thrissur secured an easy win.
